She implemented major changes to Pennsylvania's Auto Insurance Law, and developed legislative initiatives to reform Pennsylvania's Workers' Compensation Law and to provide insurance to 32,000 of Pennsylvania's medically uninsured children. In addition, Constance successfully managed the rehabilitation of Mutual Fire, Marine & Inland Insurance Company, the fourth largest insolvent property and casualty carrier in the U.S. Before serving as Insurance Commissioner, Constance was a partner in a Philadelphia law firm, where she concentrated in insurance law. Constance has lectured on corporate and insurance law for the Pennsylvania Bar Institute, the Insurance Society of Philadelphia, the Life Insurance Foundation, Central Pennsylvania Chapter of CPCU, the Preferred Institute of Educational Services and various Saul Ewing Arnstein & Lehr clients on developments affecting banks and insurance companies, litigating and preventing bad faith claims, insurance-related regulatory and public policy issues, auto coverage, and trends in the insurance marketplace.
